
Drive in cashless toll lanes where you see this sign.

NORTHERN CALIFORNIA


Rental customers who drive on any Bay Area Bridge can make payments by: 1. Accepting the PlatePass service at the rental counter; 2. Using their own transponder that is fully-funded, properly mounted, and compatible with the tollway; 3. Paying the toll authority directly online, by phone, or in person (at various locations) **up to 30 days prior to crossing the bridge or within 48 hours after crossing.** For more information, see www.bayareafastrak.org.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA (SR 73, 133, 241, 261)


